

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KTUNAXA NATION acknowledgement



The lower Kootenay Band, locally known as Yaqan Nukiy are the original inhabitants of the lower Kootenay area. Yaqan Nukiy means "where the rock stands" referring to an important place in the Creston Valley. The people of Yaqan Nukiy speak the Ktunaxa language,

which is one of the eleven original aboriginal language families in Canada, not related to any other language in the world.

Traditionally, the Yaqan Nukiy people resided along the Kootenay River and Kootenay Lake, navigating the vast wetlands on the valley floor and along the lake, hunting, fishing, and gathering in their birch bark canoe, called Yaksumit in Ktunaxa. The Yaksumit, renowned for its distinctive nose shape at both ends resembling the giant native Sturgeon fish species of the area, served as a vital tool for their way of life.

Today the Yaqan Nukiy community (also known as Lower Kootenay Band) continues to play a strong and vital role in the Creston Valley, with the band operating several important local businesses and the Yaqan Nukiy Independent School.

The Creston Valley Tourism Society acknowledges this area as part of the unceded territory of the Ktunaxa people and is grateful for the opportunity to live, play and share these beautiful lands and waterways with visitors.

DISCOVER CRESTON VALLEY

AS you discover the Creston Valley, the region in the Kootenays where east meets west, use this guide to support and enhance your explorations. Here you will find a temperate climate and expansive views, a rich history in agriculture, an extensive offering of recreation, and a delightful artisanal scene, all of which attract visitors year-round.

Tucked between the Purcell and Selkirk Mountain ranges, from the banks of the Moyie River in Yahk to the Goat and Kootenay River in the Creston Valley, meandering through rich farmlands and diverse wetlands onward to Kootenay Lake, the communities and people here are deeply connected to the area's land, water and history.

Travelling from the east, you'll find **Yahk** a small and unique hamlet known for quiet and pristine camping, day use opportunities along the Moyie River, a well-known ice cream pit-stop at Two Scoop Steve, and the diverse selection and gift shop at Yahk Soap and Candle Co. where the resident goats, Toot, Buttin and Walter are often found on the roof.

Erickson's variety of orchards and fruit stands regularly draw visitors and families, many who have been coming for generations. This bounty of locally grown fruits and vegetables, baked goods, seasonal flowers, and sweet and savoury preserves provides everything you need to prepare a meal or snack for the day's adventure, or to take home to enjoy later. Erickson is also increasingly known as the heart of the Creston Valley's growing wine scene, with four exceptional wineries, some offering tastings and light snacks while all boast stunning views of the valley.

Across the Goat River **Canyon** is known for its access to the popular Mt. Thompson - an outdoor enthusiast's paradise with some of the best hiking and views around. Add to this a beautiful community park with camping, ball fields, a horse arena, playground, and outdoor kitchen and picnic area, Canyon is also well-suited to gatherings for families and friends.

A little further south is **Lister**, home to rolling fields and dairy, grain, beef, and poultry farms – a little country paradise. Stop by the Kootenay Meadows' store to sample freshly made cheese or ice cream,





take a tour of the farm and meet the cows who make it all happen. Nearby, you will also find the Lister Park and its popular disc golf course, sports fields and playground and just down the road, the Creston Golf Club offering a challenging 18-hole course with breathtaking views from the fairways.

West of Lister is **Yaqan Nukiy** (Lower Kootenay Band), where their eye-catching office sits atop a beautiful bench overlooking the valley floor and the Kootenay River. Yaqan Nukiy is also home of the annual Traditional Pow Wow, Legend Logos Gift Shop, and Yaqan Nukiy Heritage Centre offering traditional First Nations items and history.

Just north you will find **Creston**, the commercial and business centre of the Valley. Creston is known for its vibrant and growing downtown which is worth stopping for, especially when the Creston Valley Farmers' Market is taking place. Standing tall in the centre of town are the impressive historic grain elevators, among an assortment of restaurants and charming cafés, state-of-the art recreation facilities, theatres and galleries, cool and quirky shops, a variety of professional services, and more.

West of the Kootenay River is **West Creston** where you will find the Creston Valley Wildlife Management Area, boasting diverse wildlife and year-round access to trails



for hiking, biking, snowshoeing and crosscountry skiing. Continuing up Highway 3 into the Selkirks you'll begin ascending Kootenay Pass – the third highest mountain pass highway in the world, and an area rich in alpine recreation in both summer and winter.

To the north, **Wynndel** is home to Duck Lake, with exceptional bass fishing and scenic ice-skating come winter. Continuing the drive from here along Highway 3A, you will meander along the edge of **Kootenay Lake**, with a variety of opportunities to access one of the largest freshwater lakes in BC or to stop and explore one of the small communities along the way, including Boswell, Grey Creek and Crawford Bay.

While the Creston Valley is well-known for its growing season and agriculture, what sets it apart is the quality of people that call it home and shape these communities as farmers, artists, entrepreneurs and families. It's a place where you'll not only discover fresh food, but friendly, hard-working, down-to-earth people who share a love for the valley.

Welcome to the Creston Valley! We hope you enjoy your stay and leave thinking of your next trip.

GET INSPIRED top 15 things to do in the creston valley

WHETHER you're a first-time visitor or a seasoned explorer seeking fresh adventures, when you spend time in a region brimming with opportunities, navigating the plethora of activities can be overwhelming. With this in mind, we've curated a list of our favourites to ensure you can make the most out of your stay. Enjoy!

- 1. Tour the four fantastic wineries in the region. These small-batch vineyards are part of the emerging Kootenay wine region, offering tastings, tours and some locally sourced charcuterie platters to enjoy while taking in the stunning views of the valley.
- 2. Visit the Kootenay Columbia Discovery Centre in the Creston Valley Wildlife Management Area. You'll be impressed by the environmental education, handson activities, guided canoe and walking tours, and of course the boardwalks taking you through the expansive wetlands this area is known for.
- 3. Drop by our breweries. Yes, plural. The Columbia Brewery, known for producing Kokanee – "it's the beer out here," offers tours that take you through the history of the brewery, along with samples. Newer to the Valley is Wild North Brewing Company, a craft brewery that has quickly become a favourite among locals and visitors for their rotating selection of freshly brewed beer.

- 4. Take a trip to Yahk. This beautiful drive is worth it, especially with a stop at Two Scoop Steve to enjoy some cold and delicious treats and of course visiting the Yahk Soap and Candle Co. for a little shop and to admire the adorable goats who frequent the rooftop!
- 5. Spend an afternoon exploring the bustling and energetic downtown of Creston. Pick up a coffee from one of the many cafes, peruse the variety of shops, boutiques, artisan studios and galleries that line the streets, choose a little something to remember this special time away with friends and family, and finish the experience by enjoying a little après or dinner at a local restaurant.
- 6. Get out of the Valley and into the mountains by hiking one of the many local trails found in this area. From traversing the Skimmerhorn Range to ascending the Selkirk Mountains of Kootenay Pass, seeking peace and tranquillity in the ancient Cedar Forests to walking alongside freshwater creeks or through colourful hillsides, there is something for everyone, it just depends on what you're looking for.



- 7. Explore the rivers and lakes by canoe, kayak or stand-up paddle board. Many are surprised by the serenity and natural beauty found on the Goat and Kootenay Rivers, and Duck and Kootenay Lakes which also offer the perfect opportunity to unwind and cool down.
- 8. Visit one of the most stunning and competitive 18-hole golf courses in the area, rich in history and surrounded by farmlands and forest – the Creston Valley Golf Club. Playable for every level, from novice to expert and walkable with short distances between greens and tees with rolling terrain – a wonderful way to spend a day in the Valley.
- 9. Enjoy some of the locally grown and made bounty found in the Creston Valley, whether that's by getting your hands a little dirty at a farm or orchard, enjoying a U-Pick opportunity or experiencing shopping at one of the many fruit stands in the area.
- 10. Check out the Creston Valley Farmers' Market, a bustling year-round hub showcasing the region's finest artisans and food producers. In the summer, immerse yourself in the lively outdoor market right by the Visitor Centre in downtown Creston. As temperatures drop, follow the market indoors to the Creston and District Community Complex for a cozier experience.
- 11. Spend the evening out! You won't regret enjoying live music, trivia nights, bingo or a film at one of the local venues. Or consider a night of hockey with the local KIJHL team, the Creston Valley Thunder Cats!



- 12. Learn more about the fascinating history of the area by visiting the Creston Museum or Legend Logos. Dive into the past and learn how this Valley became what it is today by exploring, experiencing and learning from the original people of this area, the Yaqan Nukiy and how forestry, mining and agriculture developed during the pioneer years.
- 13. Take a step back in time and soak up the charm of downtown Creston with a visit to the iconic Creston Grain Elevators! Built in 1935 and 1936, these towering structures are a living testament to the region's agricultural roots. While they may no longer be bustling with activity, a trip to the adjacent Kunze Gallery promises fascinating history and stunning professional art.
- 14. Drive up the East Shore of Kootenay Lake for the day. From Kootenay Bay at the north to Kuskanook at the south, there are many beaches to be discovered and charming communities full of artisan shops to enjoy along the way.
- 15. Plan a trip to Kootenay Pass in the winter months to enjoy its amazing snow! Whether snowshoeing, backcountry skiing, or snowmobiling, this area is known for its recreational opportunities and pristine outdoor experiences.

While it is unlikely you will be able to tick all of these 'to dos' off your list, we hope you get to experience some of these recommendations and that the remainder have you planning for your next trip to the Creston Valley.

Creston Valley Golf Course

I moved to the Creston Valley from Edmonton to take on the role as Head Golf Professional/Director of Golf. Originally from Niagara Falls, I saw the Creston Valley had similar weather to where I grew up and not being a fan of cold winters and enjoying hot summers, it was a perfect fit. On my days away from the course I spend time exploring Kootenay Lake either fishing or paddling in kayaks with family and stopping for freshly made doughnuts at the Mountain Barn Café.

The membership at the Creston Golf Club is very active and there is always something going on. It is such a hidden gem here in the Kootenays and our motto is "first to open and last to close." Anyone who stops and plays comes back to enjoy the great views and well-manicured greens and fairways. The golf industry is forever changing with new equipment, golf balls, and GPS. Gone are the days of buying clubs off the store shelves. With the launch of monitors, we can get the right product into a golfer's hand allowing everyone to enjoy the game at all ages. Creston is also evolving, with younger families moving into the valley bringing a more vibrant feel to the community. We see an increase of these families and new members joining Creston Golf Club annually, making the community stronger each year.

I live in the Creston Valley because... it's a small welcoming community with a long golf season that starts mid-March and goes until the end of October.

My favourite way to explore this area is... by bike or jumping into the car and seeing where the day takes us.

When people come to visit, I always recommend they... play a round at Creston Golf Club and take a picture from the best view in the valley at the 7th tee box. When heading up the lake, stop into the Mountain Barn and have a mouth-watering doughnut or cinnamon roll!

One of Creston Valley's most unique

qualities is... being so close to the border and the climate which produces some great fruits and vegetables.

PLAY in the mountains

THE Creston Valley is surrounded by mountains, each offering hiking opportunities that offer something unique to those interested in working their way to breathtaking views. Whether along the valley bottom navigating pathways and boardwalks through riparian marshlands, or along rocky trails and jagged ridgelines leading to rewarding summits, there are many opportunities and vantage points

worth discovering.

MOUNT THOMPSON TRAILS

On the east side of the Creston Valley in the Purcell Range, Thompson Mountain is home to a network of five trails that wander up, around and on top of Mount Thompson, including **Sullivan Creek** and **Thompson Rim Trails**. The latest addition is the **Bonnie Lake Trail**, which forks off the iconic Thompson Rim Trail before descending the east side to a small alpine lake that gives the trail its name.

GOAT (ARROW) MOUNTAIN TRAILS

Nestled above the Town of Creston's northern boundary, Goat Mountain is home to two popular trails, including the popular **Billy Goat Bluff Trail**, a moderately challenging trail that starts from the edge of town before winding up the mountain to a beautiful lookout point.

CRESTON VALLEY WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT AREA (CVWMA) TRAILS

In the West Creston area of the CVWMA, the **Corn Creek Marsh** and **Summit Creek** recreation areas provide five loop trails of varying lengths along boardwalks and dykes through the wetlands, marshes and bird habitat with charming names like Songbird Stroll, Wood Duck Walk and Elk Amble.

MOUNT CRESTON TRAILS

Just northwest of the CVWMA trails, this relatively easy network goes up, around, and behind Mount Creston to provide stunning vistas of the wetlands and valley including **Balancing Rock, Fern Forest, Summit Creek**, and **Mount Creston** trails.

KOOTENAY PASS TRAILS

West of Creston in the Selkirk Mountains along Hwy 3, the Pass provides trails through ancient cedar groves and to the tops of high mountain peaks popular in both summer and winter. Highlights include **Ka Papa Cedars Trail** which wanders through an ancient old growth cedar stand, and the high-altitude **Ripple Ridge** and **Cornice Ridge** trails in **Stagleap Provincial Park**.



BACKCOUNTRY TRAILS

For those with 4x4 vehicles and experience, the area also features a few rustic backcountry trails to pristine and stunning locations, including **Haystack Mountain Trail** in **Kianuko Provincial Park** and **Mount Midgley Trail** to the northwest of the Creston Valley.

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PLAY on the water



THE Creston Valley is known for its mild climate and long growing season. Luckily, it's also home to numerous lakes, rivers, and wetlands - perfect for swimming, fishing, paddling, birdwatching and wildlife viewing. Create some unforgettable memories on the water while you explore this aquatic playground.

WETLANDS

The Creston Valley Wildlife Management Area (CVWMA) supports an impressive

array of biodiversity with over 300 birds, approximately 60 mammals, 17 fish, 6 reptile and 6 amphibian species recorded. Additionally, there are thousands of invertebrate and plant species. The various ponds, channels and lakes within the CVWMA can be explored by canoe or kayak. Otherwise, an extensive network of flat-top dyke trails offers easy access to explore on foot. The **Kootenay-Columbia Discovery Centre** offers environmental education and awareness programs as well as popular guided canoe tours in the summer.

FISHING

There are 17 known species of fish in CVWMA, which can be fished for with appropriate permits (crestonwildlife.ca). In the ponds and channels and on **Duck Lake** the most popular species to fish are yellow perch and large-mouth bass. If you're looking to fish cutthroat trout, make sure to visit the **Goat** and **Kootenay River**. Heading to **Kootenay Lake** you can fish from the shore or on a boat for bull trout, gerrard rainbow trout and more. For those willing to hike in a rod, several small creeks and alpine lakes in the area also offer good fishing.

PADDLING

Home to the Kootenay and Goat Rivers, paddlers are drawn to these waterways for both kayaking and canoeing. A popular launch point on the Kootenay is the **Old Ferry Landing** at the end of Kootenay River Road, which allows for easy access for launching watercraft. For those looking for more placid paddling, the many beaches and boat launches along the **East Shore of Kootenay Lake** offer numerous access points for canoes, kayaks and stand-up paddle boards.

SWIMMING

With the warm and sunny climate found in the Creston Valley, swimming holes provide a refreshing way to cool down and reward yourself after a day's adventure. Popular local swimming holes can be found on the **Moyie River in Yahk**, the **Goat River in Creston**, and of course **Kootenay Lake**. If you're interested in a brisk, refreshing dip close to town consider a visit to the Goat Riverside Park. For those seeking relaxing beaches and sun, a visit to **Twin Bays Beach** on Kootenay Lake is a must.



SNOWSHOEING, Nordic skiing, snowmobiling and ski touring are wonderful ways to enjoy the winter season in and around the Creston Valley. From exploring a backcountry adventure on Kootenay Pass to enjoying the trails closer to home, there are many opportunities for a winter adventurer.

SNOWSHOEING AND NORDIC SKIING

While Creston itself is often snow-free during the winter months, you can find beautiful snowshoeing on the **Kootenay Pass**. Additionally, when the snow is deep enough one can enjoy snowshoeing and cross-country skiing along the unmaintained trails located in the **Corn Creek Marsh** and **Summit Creek Recreation Areas** within the Creston Valley Wildlife Management Area (CVWMA).

SNOWMOBILING

In the winter the deep snow in the mountains and back-country around the Creston area are also popular for sleds. The **Kokanee Country Snowmobile Club** also maintains and operates three riding areas and two backcountry huts, which can be accessed with an annual membership. Visit crestonsnowmobileclub.com to learn more about these riding areas and to purchase your membership for the winter.

SKI TOURING

Just a short 35-minute drive from Creston, Kootenay Pass is known for its incredible ski touring options, including popular routes in **Stagleap Provincial Park** to **Ripple Ridge** on the south and **Cornice Ridge** on the north side of Highway 3. Consider booking a course, or guided day trip with a local guide. For the truly devoted ski touring enthusiasts there are also two backcountry ski huts available for rent through the Ripple Ridge Cabin Association.

While recreating in the backcountry during the winter, it's important to be aware of current weather conditions and avalanche risk. Visit **avalanche.ca** for weather forecasts, riding conditions and avalanche risk ratings for the Creston and Kootenay Pass area.

PLAY around town and in the valley

THERE are many opportunities to be explored throughout the valley and in town with numerous community parks, a world-class community recreation complex and of course many studios offering fitness classes, strength training, yoga and dance. Additionally, for those who enjoy time outdoors, the valley is also a popular destination for golfing and road biking.

GOLF

Fore! Creston Valley is home to the **Creston Golf Club**. Established in 1954, the club is a playable course for all levels but with its rolling terrain and fast greens, can be a challenging one as well. Professionally designed and maintained, they offer various tee ranges and gradually changing elevation on both nines making it a walkable course. For those keen on another round, consider checking out the Kokanee Springs Golf Course in Crawford Bay or the smaller 9-hole community golf course in Riondel.

BIKING

Explore the Creston Valley on two wheels, where rolling hills and charming rural roads create a cycling haven. Pedal through the quaint fields and farmlands of Canyon, Lister, and West Creston, or embark on longer adventures to Yahk, up Kootenay Pass, or along the enchanting east shore of Kootenay Lake. For those interested in meeting other bikers and gaining local knowledge, consider joining the **Creston** Valley Cycling Association's weekly group ride, catering to all levels. Visit their website (crestonvalleycycling.ca) to learn more about the area, cycling routes, group ride schedules and to secure your membership.

COMMUNITY PARKS

Explore the array of community parks in the Creston area, each offering unique amenities and attractions.

Millennium Park, conveniently located near town, features an amphitheatre, Dog Park, BMX Park, and amenities such as parking, water stations, and a sani-dump for RVs. Nearby, Centennial Park is a family favourite with its refreshing Splash Park, while rural Lister Park offers a playground, baseball fields, and a popular Disc Golf Course. Additionally, Canyon, Wynndel, Yahk, and West Creston each boast their own community halls and parks equipped with sports courts, fields, and rentable kitchen and dining areas, making them perfect for hosting family reunions and special events.







GALLERIES AND PUBLIC ART

Lovers of contemporary art should visit the Kunze Gallery beside the Creston Grain Elevators, which features a rotating selection of large-scale paintings, sculptures, blown glass, ceramics, photography and textiles by accomplished artists. The nearby Tilted Brick Gallery also exhibits works by emerging and mid-career contemporary artists and is well worth a visit.

HERITAGE ATTRACTIONS

Want to find out what made the Creston Valley the place it is today? At the **Creston Museum** take a self-guided tour or book one with knowledgeable staff who can provide you the 'inside scoop' on all things Creston. Meanwhile the Yaqan Nukiy Heritage Centre at Legend Logos offers visitors an opportunity to learn about the culture



and history of the Ktunaxa people and see some of their unique traditionally made products like fish traps, buckskin dresses and beadwork, and the unique sturgeon-nosed canoe.

Finally, one can't help but note the historic twin Creston Grain Elevators towering over the downtown, representing an agricultural industry that was a significant part of Creston's economy and among the few remaining in British Columbia.



This farm to table opportunity is such a special and meaningful experience whether shopping to take home to create a meal, or just enjoying at a local restaurant during your stay.





ERIN HARRIS Kootenay Meadows Farm

I was lucky to have grown up on our family dairy farm in Lister, nestled at the base of the Thompson Mountain Range. The

Creston Valley is unique in the diversity of the farming possible here and this helped to inspire my love of the agriculture industry.

I left the valley to attend University and to work, but always knew my heart was in the Kootenays. There is something about the power and beauty of our farm that drew me back, returning full time in 2018 and beginning the transition of taking over our dairy and processing company, Kootenay Meadows. We bottle organic grass-fed milk from our own herd of well-loved cows as well as make artisanal cheeses with our own milk. Our goal is to farm in a way that is sustainable both ecologically and economically. We focus on having healthy soils that help to grow forage and grain crops, feed happy cows and produce local products.

The community of Creston and the Kootenay region have enabled our business to grow. I don't think there are many places as supportive of local food and farmers, and I am incredibly grateful to farm in the way I believe so deeply in. I am also incredibly grateful for an amazing team of staff who work hard to help produce such beautiful products. My brother, Foster Harris, especially who does the fluid processing and the cheese making.

I live in the Creston Valley because... I love the community and it is ideally suited to farming sustainably.

My favourite way to explore this area is... with my dogs out for a walk. I tend to spend much of my time on the farm but am trying to get outdoors to enjoy the beautiful hiking trails.

When people come to visit, I always recommend they... in summer tour Erickson and visit the fruit stands, wineries and stop for a coffee at Good Company. In winter go for a snack and coffee at Buffalo Trails then wander down main street to see the shops.

One of Creston Valley's most unique qualities is... the incredibly diverse agriculture industry. The topography of our valley creates microclimates that allow us to grow so much.

From Erickson to Lister, the Creston Valley is home to a variety of farms and orchards dedicated to growing and creating beautiful and fresh produce and products. Many also have storefronts, offer tours and tastings, or you-pick opportunities, allowing you to interact, learn and create a memorable experience.

Driving through the valley in the late summer, the bounty and number of fruit stands and markets along the roadside is hard to miss. There is an energy in this harvest, as Creston's famous fruit and vegetables are on full display. And for those looking to brighten their day or to share with others? Fresh cut flowers from **Brittany's Flower Farm** may be just what you need.

In downtown Creston, there are several butchers, coffee roasters and other artisanal producers using this bounty to their favour, including the well-known **Famous Fritz's** **Butcher** producing some of the finest butchered meats in the Kootenays. Do you have a sweet tooth? Take a drive north of Creston to visit **Swan Valley Honey** and pick up a jar (or more) of artisanal wildflower honey.

And of course, a visit to the area wouldn't be complete without attending the awardwinning **Creston Valley Farmers' Market**, held downtown on Saturday mornings, April to October. From November to March, the market moves indoors at the Creston Rec Complex, running the first Saturday of each month.

PLANNING YOUR TRIP driving routes

NOW that you've tackled the big decisions, such as when you're coming, where you're staying and what to do, it's time to dive into the nitty-gritty details! From mapping out the best travel routes and ferry schedules to navigating international border crossings and time zones, here you'll find the essential information needed to finalize your adventure.

DRIVING ROUTES

Whether travelling by car, motorcycle or RV, the Creston Valley area is a breeze to get to no matter which direction on the compass you are coming from!

HIGHWAY 3 FROM THE EAST ⋖⋗

Creston and Yahk can be reached from Lethbridge, Fernie, and Cranbrook, via Crowsnest Highway

3 while Highway 95 junction at Cranbrook connects Calgary, Banff, Invermere and Golden. Cranbrook is also home to the Canadian Rockies International Airport, with daily flights from Vancouver and Calgary.

HIGHWAY 3 FROM THE WEST <>

Creston and Yahk can also be reached from Vancouver, Osoyoos, Castlegar and Nelson via Crowsnest Highway 3, with Highway 97 junction at Osoyoos connecting to Kelowna and the Okanagan.


HIGHWAY 3A FROM THE NORTH

Creston can be reached from Naksusp, Kaslo and Nelson via Highway 3A and Highway 31. At Balfour the free Kootenay Lake ferry crosses to Kootenay Bay on the east shore, where Highway 3A continues to Creston.

IDAHO STATE HIGHWAY 1 AND US 95 FROM THE SOUTH

Creston and Yahk can be reached from Spokane, Coeur d'Alene, Sandpoint and Bonners Ferry via US 95. While US 95 continues to Kingsgate and Yahk, the Idaho State Highway 1 junction north of Bonners Ferry connects to Creston.

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

PLANNING YOUR TRIP ferry and border information



KOOTENAY LAKE FERRY AND HWY 3A

The Kootenay Lake Ferry is the longest free ferry ride in British Columbia, crossing Kootenay Lake multiple times a day between Balfour Ferry Terminal on the lake's west arm to Kootenay Bay Ferry Terminal on the lake's east shore. This scenic ride across the lake is popular with many visitors to the region and takes approximately 35 minutes.

Kootenay Bay then connects to Creston via the scenic Highway 3A, which meanders along the east shore of Kootenay Lake, taking approximately one hour and 20 minutes. Due to the windy nature of this two-lane road, visitors are advised to drive with caution.

BORDER CROSSINGS

The Creston Valley Area is a short drive from the United States/Canadian border and is a very accessible destination from Idaho, Washington and Montana via the two following border crossings.

1. RYKERTS/PORTHILL BORDER CROSSING

Closest port of entry to Creston, which is 15 minutes north. Open 7 days a week, with daytime hours of operation (changing seasonally). Contact office for current hours 1-250-428-2575.



TIME ZONE

Here in the Creston area, time stands still! Okay, that may be a bit of an exaggeration, but hear us out. While we are on Mountain Time (MT) like our eastern neighbours, we have chosen not to observe Daylight Savings Time (DST) during the summer, same as the majority of the U.S. State of Arizona and the Province of Saskatchewan.

What does this mean for you? It means we keep a consistent time throughout the year. In summer we pass on the Daylight Savings, sync up with the Pacific Time Zone and soak up all those long days! Then, when winter rolls in we skip the "fall back," keep that extra hour of daylight, and line back with the Mountain Time Zone without losing a wink of sleep!
